“I’d really like a young person to take this position,” Sherry Mast said to me as we walked the wooded paths at Celebration. Sherry served as NYMC’s representative on the Mennonite Central Committee East Coast Board until she and LeRoy moved to Indiana this fall.

But how many young people could bring the passion, experience and availability this position requires? MCC East Coast Board sets policy, direction, programs, and budgets for the work of MCC East Coast. Board members need to travel to semi-annual meetings, keep current on the work of MCC worldwide, find and connect with shoulder-tappers in each congregation, and link effectively with their constituency.

Sherry’s hopes were answered when we talked with Dovanna Zehr in the Lakeside Chapel at Celebration the next day.

Through MCC’s SALT program, Dovanna served for two years at Talita Cumi Children’s Home in Santa Cruz, Bolivia

(Aug. 2006 to July 2008). Dovanna is currently serving on the advisory board for Talita Cumi. Her experience with MCC and her heart for its work have clearly prepared her to serve in this position.

Dovanna is a member of Lowville Mennonite Church, and daughter of Joe and Malinda Zehr.

Sponsorship has dropped off and hardships have increased due to the economy, current unrest and political strain.”

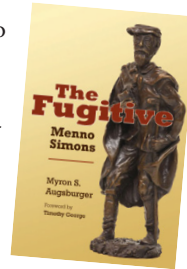

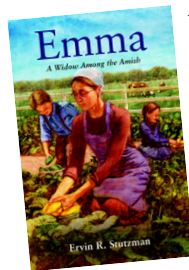
The Fugitive: Menno Simons

It's 1544, and Menno Simons, a leader in the new—and persecuted—free church movement, is on the run from authorities in the Netherlands. With a price on his head, he stops to catch his breath and prays, "Lord, what do I do now?" Myron Augsburger's historical novel recalls Menno's life—from Catholic priest to radical reformer to hunted fugitive.



Emma: A Widow Among the Amish

A true story woven by strands of faith, family, and community. Ervin R. Stutzman tells the story of his mother, Emma, who raised six children after the sudden death of her husband, Tobias. In the aftermath of the tragedy, Emma copes with her entrepreneurial husband's significant business failures. Ervin R. Stutzman, author of the highly commended Tobias of the Amish, now turns to his mother and rediscovers the strength of a woman whose early married life was defined by stress and tragedy.



Emerald Angel

A mysterious path through an orchard in the Emerald Valley of British Columbia, Canada, attracts the attention of young Ava, who knows that her grandmother's house is at the end of that trail. Why do so many local people visit Ava's grandmother with their troubles and problems? As Ava watches, her grandmother blesses the visitors with her extraordinary gifts of compassion, empathy and, most of all, listening.

In an age before many people relied on professional counseling, emotional caregivers came from the community. Ava's grandmother is such a caregiver, gifted with unusual insight—and said to have seen an angel.
